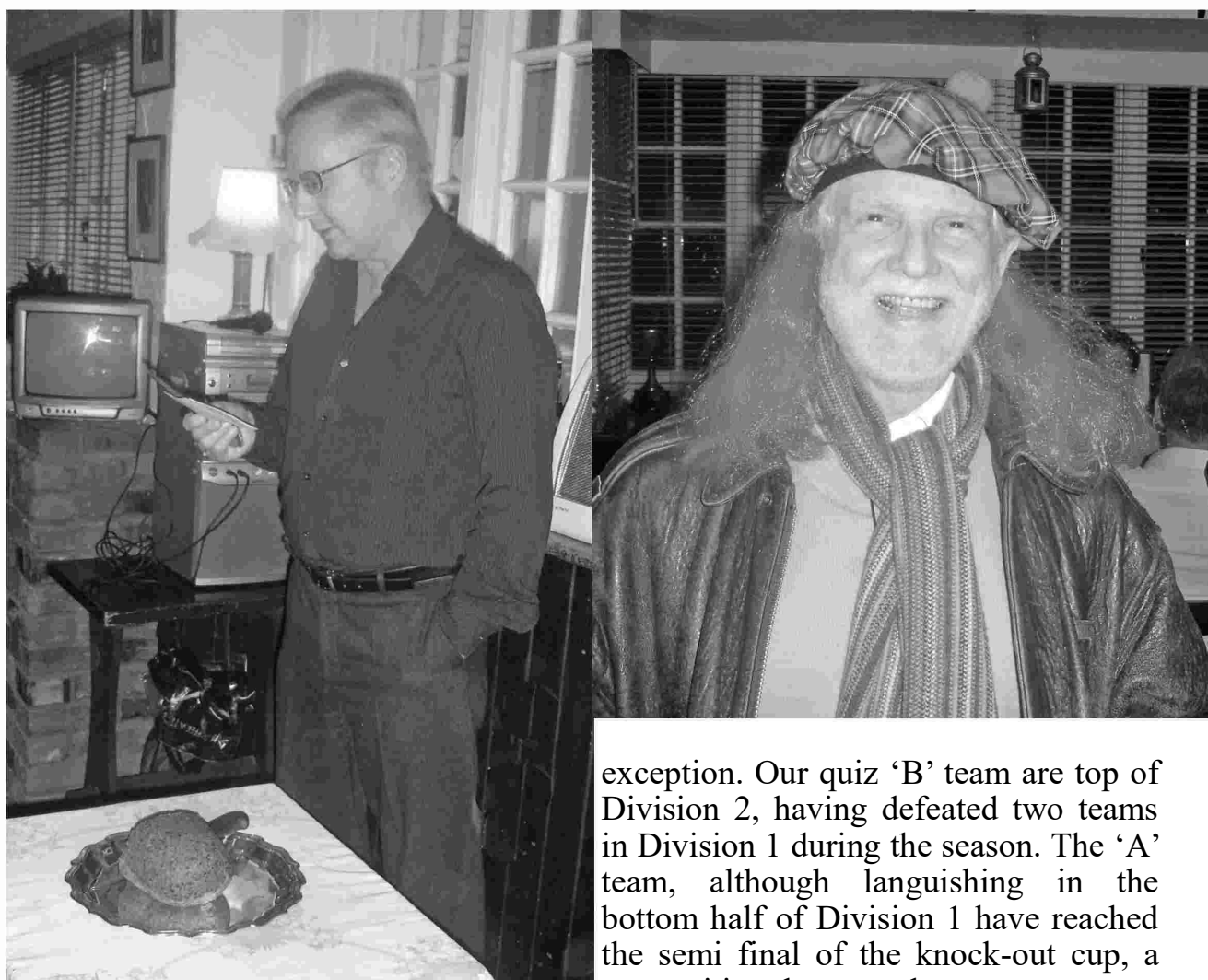


Red Lion

Clear Car Campaign

Clearing your car

A Clear Car Campaign has been launched by Chiltern District Council and Thames Valley Police in a bid to reduce levels of car crime in the district.

Motorists who leave valuables on display will be sent letters warning their vehicles are at risk from thieves.

Police Community Support Officers from Thames Valley Police and Officers from Chiltern District Council's Community Safety and Civil Enforcement will record details of vulnerable vehicles. Motorists will then be sent a letter indicating where and when the vehicle was spotted and what was left on display alongside some appropriate crime prevention advice.

Thames Valley Police Crime Reduction Advisor, Mike Levine said: 'We hope that by encouraging vehicle owners to remove temptation for thieves, this will limit their opportunity to offend. Simply hiding items isn't enough. The glove box or under the seat are the first places they will look for your sat-nav'.

Securing your car

'Lock up your cars' is the message from the Chiltern Police Commander, Ian Hunter, after a recent rise in theft from motor vehicles. It is not just in car parks or when you are away from home that you should remove all valuables and secure your car. Cars are also vulnerable at home on your driveway, especially if left insecure.

In Chiltern **62%** of vehicles that had items stolen during a three month period were **unlocked** at the time of the incident. (Data is from 1st Oct - 31st Dec 2009). Many criminals are opportunists who travel into the area looking for unlocked cars so to protect yourself make sure that you lock your car and close all the windows before leaving your car unattended.

Free Fire Safety Checks

Free safety checks are available from Buckinghamshire Fire & Rescue Service. Free smoke alarms are fitted where required, and firefighters will also help you find out more about other useful local services if you are interested.



The checks take about 30 minutes each and are usually carried out by firefighters. They will offer fire safety advice, based on any potential fire risks identified and answer questions. They will then fit as many smoke alarms as they think necessary.

Here are the top tips to ensure you and your family stay safe from fire:

Fit and maintain a smoke alarm: You should have one on each level of your

home and test it weekly.

Plan your escape route: Make sure you and your family know the quickest way out in the event of fire.

In the event of a fire, get out, stay out and call 999: Don't delay for valuables, and don't investigate or try to tackle the fire. Use a mobile, a neighbour's phone or a phone box to call 999. If someone needs to be rescued wait safely outside for the firefighters who have the equipment and training to do it. Never go back in.

Check on others: When you visit relatives or friends, look out for safety hazards in the home. Offer to help test their alarm and plan escape routes together.

Keep internal doors shut: This will slow down the spread of fire.

Coleshill History Project

The finale of the Coleshill History Project was a splendid dinner held at The Judges' Lodgings in Aylesbury on Thursday 21st January 2010. It celebrated the end of nearly three years of meetings and research, successfully culminating in the publication of Julian Hunt's book 'A History of Coleshill' in November of last year.

Peter Lawrence organised the dinner and thirty of us, including Julian and his wife, were greeted with champagne in The Members' Lounge followed by an excellent dinner in The Large Dining Room surrounded by portraits of former Lord Lieutenants, the table being decorated with a collection of silver from the Bucks Battalion. Sadly the famous portrait of Queen Elizabeth I which used to grace the judges at dinner had been sold at Sotheby's for £2.6 million!

Peter thanked Julian and the members of the history project for all their hard work and Julian added his thanks and gave us the background to the Judges' Lodgings. They were built on the site of the old gaol in 1849 when Aylesbury succeeded in being granted the winter and summer assizes over its arch rival, Buckingham, the judges greatly favouring the entertainment available in Aylesbury.

We have all greatly enjoyed the project and in particular Julian's enthusiastic and stimulating talks on different aspects of the local history. His next project is a history of Bromsgrove where he grew up and the Coleshill History Society is going to continue under the chairmanship of Chris Wege.

Coleshill History Project

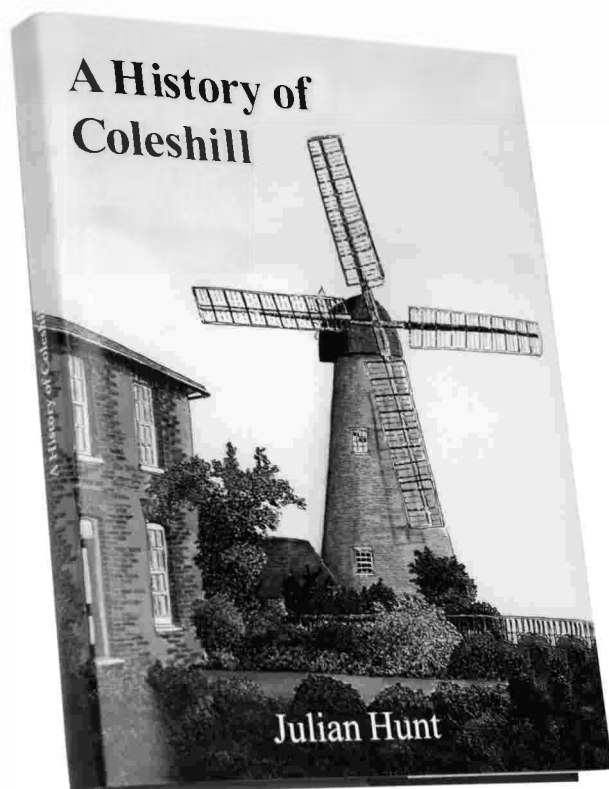

Thank you to everyone who came to our Christmas Bazaar or Quiz Night. We always appreciate your support at our school events. Our very active Parents' and Friends' Association meet regularly to arrange activities and raise money for the school. The children benefit enormously by having extra resources and activities provided for them. For instance, 'Professor Brainstorm' is visiting us this term to lead his very exciting 'Amazing Light and Sound' science show. We are also taking all the children to Green Park for a special day of outdoor learning with a 'Gruffalo' theme.

Earlier this term we were very fortunate to have a visit by Julian Hunt, the author of 'A History of Coleshill'. He gave a very interesting talk to the children about the history of Coleshill, in particular the school, which the children found fascinating. A very generous villager bought a copy of the book for every child and member of staff in the school, which Julian helped to present on the day. We would like to say a very big thank you to our kind, anonymous benefactor. Several children and parents wrote to say thank you and how much they appreciated this very generous gesture.

Our school is an 'eco school'. We have just applied for Green Flag status and hope to be assessed by the end of term. This means the children learn how to look after our environment, trying to be as 'green' as possible, by recycling, saving energy and water, keeping litter-free and learning about wildlife. The older children have led several campaigns raising awareness of environmental issues such as using tap water, (not bottled water), using rechargeable batteries and switching off standby. We are currently the top school in the country for medals on the Eco Schools'

Pod website (5 gold and 1 silver). We have new nesting boxes in the garden to watch the birds and raised beds for the children to grow herbs, vegetables and flowers. Our annual 'Big Tidy Up' has been organised for Saturday, April 24th for adults to clear out our sheds and tidy up in and around the school. We took part in 'Fair-trade Fortnight', learning about coffee, tea and chocolate

production, culminating in a 'Big Brew' tea party for the whole school. The children made their own chocolate lollies using fair-trade chocolate. We are also observing international 'Earth Hour' on Saturday 27th March 2010, encouraging all our families to switch off the lights for one hour to save energy at 8.30 p.m. On the Friday, we are having a 'Wear Something Bright Day' in order to highlight the event and make it fun for the children.

Our Easter service this year takes place at All Saints' Church on Thursday, April 1st 2010 at 11.00 a.m. You are very warmly invited to join us. Happy Easter everyone.
